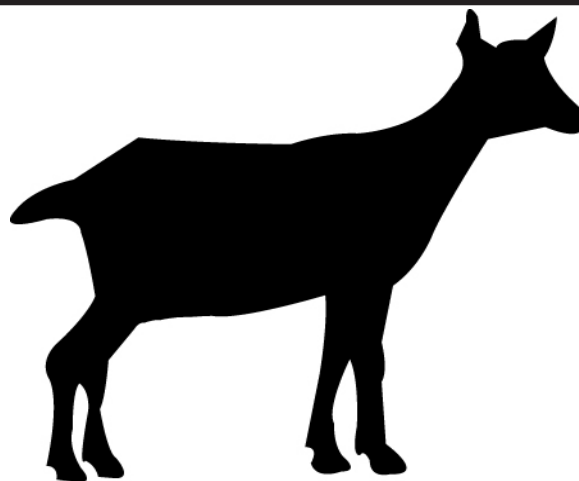

## ARRIVAL TIME

- All NON-Montgomery County exhibitors must arrive on SUNDAY, August 11th and be in place no later than 11am. Please enter via 16 Chestnut Street Entrance.
- If you are interested in arriving prior to Sunday please contact Kaylene Lyons directly by August 1st to see if a Friday/Saturday arrival is possible. There are no guarantees.
- All Montgomery County exhibitors may arrive as early as Friday, August 9th but must be in place by 11am Sunday, August 11th. See General Rules and Regulations, Rule #15

## CHECK-IN TIMES at Barn #38

- ALL EXHIBITORS: Sunday, Aug. 11th from 11am-1pm
- Montgomery County Exhibitors may check in early on Saturday, Aug. 10th from 5-7pm.

## ANIMALS RELEASED

- Non-Montgomery County Exhibitors residing in barn 35 must be cleaned out by 2pm Wednesday, August 14. Non-Montgomery County residents may leave immediately following the close of Tuesday's show with proper clean out of pens.
- Montgomery County exhibitors are expected to stay for the entirety of fair week unless there are circumstances approved in advance by the superintendent for early release.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors are subject to the general rules and regulations and the livestock rules in addition to the particular rules listed here.
2. NO Dairy Goat Bucks allowed on the Fairgrounds.
3. The American Dairy Goat Association (ADGA) sanctions the shows and their rules shall govern. We have two separately sanctioned ADGA Doe shows. Monday's show will be an ADGA Open Junior/Doe Show. Tuesday will be an ADGA Open Combined Junior/Senior Doe Show. (The Junior and Senior Does are not separately sanctioned for this show). We would like to ask you to be willing to also show your Junior Does in our combined Junior/Senior show if needed to make a breed official. You are welcome to enter your Junior Does in both shows; however premiums will only be paid to the Junior Does in the separately sanctioned Junior Doe Show. Also you will only pay entry fees for your Junior Does in the separately sanctioned Junior Doe Show. **A registration paper must accompany all animals upon arrival; or a stamped ADGA duplicate application for registration will be accepted.**
4. These are ADGA sanctioned shows and thus are open to all exhibitors. There are no limits on the number of animals that can be entered in a class by an exhibitor; however only **2 premiums are paid per exhibitor per class.**
5. Please make copies and use a separate entry form for each exhibitor. Please make copies if needed.
  - a. Exhibitors can combine in Get-of-Sire and Produce of Dam, and Dam and Daughter classes. All combined groups must be entered under one exhibitor's name by July 20.
  - b. Entries for the Herd classes must be that of one farm. Family members may combine entries in these classes.
  - c. Substitutions are allowed only within the same breed, the same show and the same family. These changes must be completed no later than Sunday, August 11th end of check-in time (by 1pm). Additions and Substitutions will not be allowed ringside. There

will be no exceptions.

- d. August 11, 2024 is the date to use for computing the ages of animals.
6. Barn space is limited. Entries close when the barns are full.
  7. Exhibitors must provide their own feed and hay. NOTE: Storage is very limited and no more than one tack area will be planned for any barn. Please provide for your own storage. All aisles must remain accessible for Fair patrons.
  8. PEN FEES—A pen fee of \$5 per assigned pen is collected at time of Sunday check-in. Exhibitors **must clean their own pens** or make arrangements to have them cleaned prior to leaving. **Notification of pens may be given upon arrival; exhibitors are to be prepared in case notification of the amount expected is not given.** Pen fees will be collected by a designee of the superintendent.
  9. MILK-OUT shall be at the discretion of each exhibitor. All exhibitors MUST dump their milk in the milk tank in Barn 38, unless its being utilized.
  10. Show attire - All white is preferred, but black pants will be accepted in the show ring.
  11. Show decorum - Exhibitors should be respectful of the judge, show secretary, ring steward, superintendents and fellow exhibitors. Please follow directions on use of the ring area during the show from the show secretary, ring steward and superintendents.

### CLASSES FOR JUNIOR DOE SHOW:

1. Junior Kids: Does born on or after April 1 of this year.
2. Intermediate Kids: Does born in March of this year.
3. Senior Kids: Does born between Dec. 1 last year and March 1 of this year.
4. Dry Yearling: Does under 2 years, not yet fresh.
5. Junior Grand Champion (winners of classes 1-4).
6. Reserve Junior Champion—Ribbon (includes second place winners).
7. Junior Get of Sire: Three does under two years not in milk, from the same sire.
8. Junior Best Three Females: Three does under two years, not in milk, registered to same exhibitor.
9. Junior Produce of Dam: Two does, not in milk, from the same dam.
10. Best Junior Doe in Show—Plaque and Banner.

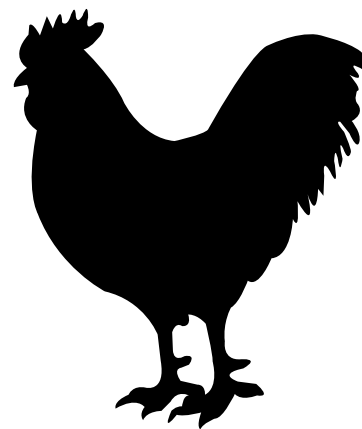

#### **CLASSES FOR COMBINED JUNIOR/SENIOR DOE SHOW:**

11. Junior Doe: Does under 2 years, not yet fresh.
12. Junior Champion (selected from winners of classes 11).
13. Reserve Junior Champion: (second place from class 11).
14. Milking Yearlings: Does in milk under two years.
15. Does in Milk two years and under three years.
16. Does in Milk three years and under four years.
17. Does in Milk four years and under five years.
18. Does in Milk five years and under six years.
19. Does in Milk six years and older.
20. Senior Champion: Selected from winners of classes 14–20).
21. Reserve Senior Champion: Includes second place winners.
22. Best Udder: Includes first and second place winners chosen by the judge from Classes 14–19, 25. **Only 1st and 2nd places will receive a premium.**
23. Grand Champion—Plaque and Banner: Selected from the Junior and Senior Grand Champions.
24. Reserve Grand Champion: Includes Reserve Champion to Animal Select Grand Champion.
25. Champion Challenge.
26. Senior Get-of-Sire: Three does in milk of the same sire.
27. Produce-of-Dam: Two does of the same dam. One doe must be in milk. Junior does must be shown in their age classes for this show.
28. Senior Best 3 Females: Three does in milk bred and owned by exhibitor.
29. Dairy Herd: Three does in milk, from the same farm.
30. Dam and Daughter: Both does must be shown in their age classes for this show.
31. Best Doe Bred and Owned by Exhibitor for 75th Anniversary—One entry per exhibitor. Doe can be any age, any breed, but must be bred and owned by Exhibitor showing.
32. Best Udder in Show, selected from 1st place winners of class 22—Banner.
33. Best Senior Doe in Show—Perpetual Trophy and Rosette.
